



In a world of impermanence, Love is the constant





When I think about Lent. I can't help but be amazed at the love that God showed for us by sending Jesus to earth. Isn't it hard to fathom a love so deep that Jesus would be willing to go to the cross and die for us? It is an amazing love that is given to each of us each second, each minute, each hour, of each day. God's love is everlasting. Yet, we tend to cling to things of this world even This being so, the

miracle of love between two people, or within a family, is something precious. We are together for a while and then inevitably we part. To love someone truly is to see the preciousness of the time we have together, and to make the effort to open our hands, so that instead of holding on we are nurturing and supporting. People often wonder how it is possible, in the face of impermanence, to make a commitment to a relationship. We have two choices when it comes to impermanence - we can deny that people and things here on earth are temporary and as a result try to control and hold on, or we can accept it and live each moment to the fullest. But ironically, it is exactly impermanence that inspires commitment because deep down we know that things always change. We give our vow to remain faithful to love, because love is the only thing that is in harmony with change.

Love is a feeling of openness, and appreciation for the wonder of the world, a feeling that we can be true to, no matter what circumstances may bring. Jesus shows us how to love by giving and asking for nothing in return. That is what love really is. "This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you. There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 13:12-13). To really love someone without expecting something in return is to lay one's life down. We live in a world of self-interest. Therefore, it seems to me that truly



learning to love is a spiritual practice. The journey of a loving relationship is our best chance to develop love and compassion for others – to grow in the traits of Jesus. It seems only logical that in order to develop a deep and abiding love for all, even our enemies, we need to have somewhere to start, someone to practice on. To really love your friend, husband, wife, or child expecting nothing in return is to take on the most challenging and worthwhile of life's projects. We know it is possible to do this because we have all felt the deep, abiding type of love at one time or another.

Our most precious relationships appear when we are fully met. When we hide nothing, distort nothing, justify nothing, protect nothing, hold back nothing. It is a moment when the person we encounter will accept, treasure, and celebrate "the us" that is then touched by "them". At this moment we can fully relax, trust-and consequently all anxiety and frustration drop away. We find ourselves being wholly received. Have you felt like this? Seen it in others? Do you deeply long for this meeting?

God wholly receives us in this manner. Even though life on earth has a timetable, God's love never ends. Romans 8: 38-39 tells us that "And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. ³⁹ No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord." This is what Lent is all about. It is about a God that loved us so deeply that He suffered and died for us that we might have eternal life. During all of the weeks of Lent, I hope that you might take some time reflect on what it means to you that God loves you this deeply. With God you can be wholly received and be accepted and treasured. Our greatest growth comes when we can tell God anything. How can you build your relationship with God this deeply? How could you learn to love others in this same way – expecting nothing in return except the joy of the precious time that you have together? For March, I pray that you seek and find the incredible love that God has to offer. Pastor Jan

What is Lent? Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.



Ash Wednesday Prayer Stations February 26th, 4:00-6:00 p.m. What is Ash Wednesday? Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. Historically, ashes signified purification and sorrow for sins. The ash cross on the forehead is an outward sign of our sorrow and repentance for sins. This Ash Wednesday we will have a number of prayer stations including a "wailing wall" to leave our deepest sorrows, an anointing station for healing, and, of course, a station for the application of ashes. This will truly be a spiritual experience. Don't skip Ash Wednesday – make it part of your Lenten practice.

Sunday, March 29th 5th Sunday of Lent and Youth Sunday.

Sunday, April 5th Palm and Passion Sunday

April 9th, Maundy Thursday Service 6:00 pm.

Maundy Thursday is an alternate name for Holy Thursday, the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. The English word "Maundy" comes from the Latin *mandatum*, which means "commandment." As recorded in John's gospel, on his last night before his betrayal and arrest, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and then gave them a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34). The service also includes communion which was known as the Last Supper.

April 10th, Good Friday Stations of the Cross at 3:00 p.m.

We will follow Jesus on the Via Dolorosa to Calvary by reading and praying the stations of the cross.

April 12th, Easter Sunday

7:00 a.m. Sunrise Service at the Lady Lake Welcome Center followed by a light breakfast in the CLC Fellowship Hall

10:00 a.m. Traditional Easter Worship Celebration



Rummage Sale Volunteers Needed




